






Climate and Culture

Blueprint for Success: English Language Arts

- Annual Improvement Target 60% of students in Literature,
 Analysis, and Composition I and II courses will demonstrate growth
 from the Form A to the Form C administration of the LinkIt!
 benchmark assessment, as indicated by an increase in score or an
 increase in performance level
- Action Plan:
 - Tier I Strategies (All students)
 - Increase implementation of non-fiction texts across curricular areas
 - Utilize high impact instructional strategies aligned with ELCO's Instructional Focus Priorities for 2023-2024
 - Tier 2 Strategies (Targeted students)
 - Provide targeted intervention to support specific areas of needs identified through data analysis



Blueprint for Success: Readiness for Learning

 Annual Improvement Target - By spring 2024, student perception data, as measured by the Jostens Pulse Survey, will indicate a score of 60 or higher in the categories of "Formal Recognition" and "Recognition of Effort."

Action Plan:

- Tier I Strategies (All students)
 - Develop procedures and programs that facilitate the recognition of student effort and achievement on a broader scale through more formalized recognition programs.
 - Emphasize consistent recognition of effort through revitalization of Raider Rewards.
- Tier 2 Strategies (Targeted students)
 - Develop alternative methods of recognition to support traditionally underserved populations.

Blueprint for Success: Future Readiness

- Annual Improvement Target Increase the number of students completing career-focused Future Ready activities, including work-based learning experiences and earning industry recognized credentials, to 33% of the graduating class.
- Action Plan:
 - Tier I Strategies (All students)
 - Students will have access to complete career-focused learning experiences through the Future Ready Facilitator.
 - Tier 2 Strategies (Targeted students)
 - Seniors who have not fulfilled one of the Pennsylvania Pathways to Graduation by the end of the first marking quarter will be referred to the Future Ready Facilitator for targeted support in completing career-focused activities.

Points of Pride

- Completion of Agriculture Science and Technology Education addition completed for opening of 2023-2024 school year
- Expansion of dual enrollment opportunities for students
- Future Ready Facilitator position
- Increased enrollment in Lebanon County Career and Technology Center programs
- 99% of students in the Class of 2023 who completed local graduation requirements also fulfilled Pennsylvania's Pathways to Graduation requirements by the date of graduation
