## What does PBIS do?

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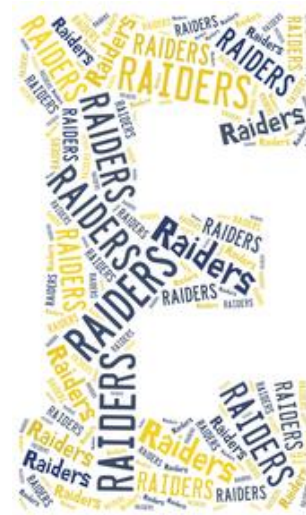
The PBIS team analyzes discipline related behavioral patterns and responds to them by teaching the positive behaviors expected by our students.

## Positive Behavior Incentives
