KINDERGARTEN 2018-2019 INFORMATION

If you have a child who will be turning 5 years old on or before September 1, 2018, he or she is eligible to be registered for Kindergarten for the 2018-2019 school year.

A Kindergarten Orientation Meeting will be held on March 27th at 6:30 p.m. at the ELCO Middle School Forum (parents only, please). Enrollment packets containing all necessary paperwork required for your child's enrollment will be available at this meeting.

You may also complete the required paperwork prior to the Orientation Meeting. Enrollment information packets are available at both K-2 buildings (Fort Zeller or Jackson Elementary School), as well as the District Office. This same information may also be downloaded from the ELCO website under "District Information".

All enrollment forms are to be completed and returned to the DISTRICT OFFICE no later than April 6, 2018. We understand that some forms and appointments (dental and physical exams) may not be completed by this time; however, please turn in all other paperwork prior to these appointments. Turning all documents in as soon as possible gives us ample time for processing of information prior to your child's Kindergarten Screening.

ELCO HALL OF FAME

Hall of Fame

The Eastern Lebanon County School District Hall of Fame seeks to recognize individuals who have achieved noteworthy and outstanding accomplishments in their chosen fields and who will serve as role models for students currently enrolled in the ELCO School District. Individuals who are selected to the ELCO School District Hall of Fame are recognized during ELCO's Homecoming activities in the fall of each year. Additionally, a commemorative plaque signifying the individual's selection is hung on the "ELCO Hall of Fame" wall, which is located in the main hallway of the ELCO High School.

In order to be considered for selection into the ELCO School District Hall of Fame, candidates must have been a member of a class that graduated at least 10 years prior to nomination and must have attended public school within the boundaries of the Eastern Lebanon County School District. Previous nominees have demonstrated outstanding records of performance in a profession, business, occupation, and/or public service. Once nominated, that candidate will be considered for five (5) consecutive years and need not be nominated each year; nominated individuals may have pertinent material added to their application as long as the information is submitted by the deadline for all nominations as stated below. In the event an individual is not selected within five (5) years of being nominated, a new nomination form must be submitted for future consideration.

Nomination forms for the 2018 ELCO School District Hall of Fame will be available in the coming weeks on the school district's website and in the ELCO High School main office. Nomination forms and supporting documentation must be submitted to the High School office by **Monday, May 14, 2018** in order to be considered for the 2018 Hall of Fame selection. After this date, a selection committee, comprised of individuals representing the school community, will review all received nomination forms and the 2018 ELCO Hall of Fame inductee will be chosen.

The ELCO School District is looking for anyone from the community who would be willing to help plan the events for the 2018 ELCO School District Hall of Fame. The District is also seeking community members who would be willing to serve on the selection committee to review the nominees and ultimately be involved in the selection of the 2018 ELCO School District Hall of Fame inductee. ATHLETICALLY SPEAKING

As the winter season winds down, let's take note of what has been happening with the sports programs here at ELCO. We have approximately two hundred students participating on our winter teams. All of these athletes are growing and learning through participation in athletics. The varsity activities we offer through the winter months are cheerleading, bowling, wrestling, indoor track & field, and girls' and boys' basketball. We also offer wrestling, basketball, and cheerleading on the junior high level.

Cheerleading

The cheerleading squad can be seen and heard at the boys' basketball games. This winter season consists of fifteen girls. The squad is coached by third year head coach Alysha Burkholder and the assistant coach is Elizabeth Yearwood.

Wrestling

The wrestling team is currently 14-6 with one match still remaining on the schedule. The team hosted two tournaments at ELCO this year. Good luck to all the wrestlers that will advance into individual post-season competition.

Bowling

The bowling team is in a rebuilding season under the direction of first year head coach Frannie Slabonik. The team finished the season with a 7-84 record. Jacob Hitz is the top bowler on the team and has a chance to qualify for the District Tournament.

Girls' Basketball

The girls' basketball team finished the season with an 11-11 record. Rylelle Shuey is the top scorer for the Raiders and many other underclassmen on the team return next year.

Boys' Basketball

The boys' team finished the regular season with a 12-10 record. Congratulations to the team who qualified for the District III Tournament, which takes 10 teams into the 4A Classification Tournament.

Swimming










CONGRATULATIONS TO THE ELCO EMT PROGRAM

ELCO SENIOR VOLUNTEER TAX PROGRAM

Applications Due by June 30th

The ELCO School District will, again, offer an opportunity for retired senior citizen homeowners who are 60 years of age or older, to participate in the senior volunteer tax work-off program.

The program allows retired senior citizens to volunteer up to 76 hours at \$7.25 per hour, for a tax credit totaling a maximum of \$550. Participants may continue to volunteer after reaching 76 hours but will not receive tax credit for those hours. Tasks may include selling tickets at athletic events, tutoring children, assisting with drama productions, serving as an advisor to student groups, working as substitute custodians, or grounds keeping within the district. Clearances are required for anyone working in a public school. They can be acquired at no cost when choosing "Volunteer".

New Law Impacts Public Education

Parents should be aware of these changes in state law under Act 55 of 2017 that became effective on Nov. 6, 2017:

Delay in graduation requirements: The use of state Keystone Exams in Algebra I, Biology and Literature as a graduation requirement is delayed until the 2019-20 school year.

School meals: Schools may not deny a meal to a student, regardless of whether he or she has money to pay for the meal or owes money. Students who cannot pay or owe money cannot be publicly identified or stigmatized, be required to perform chores or forced to discard a meal after it was served.

Emergency drills: Schools may conduct a security drill to practice procedures to respond to an emergency situation, such as an act of terrorism, armed intruder sitution or other violent threat. Schools must notify and request assistance from local law enforcements and emergency management agencies, and must notify parents in advance of the drill.

Opioid abuse prevention: Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, schools must provide instruction to students in grades 6-12 related to the prevention of opioid abuse.

Agricultural education: The subject of forestry is added to the list of agricultureal education topics for which the state must provide resources and programming to students in grades K-12. A new Commission for Agricultural Education Excellence will assist the Departments of Education and Agricultural in continuing efforts regarding agricultural education.

PSSA Test changes for spring 2018

The PA Department of Education (PDE) announced that students in grades 3 through 8 will spend an average of 20% less time on statewide PSSA testing this year, and an even greater reduction – nearly 25% - for the youngest students. The tests have been shortened wihout changing the rigor of these assessments, which could eliminate up to two full testing days for some schools. For test administration in 2019, PDE anticipates shortening that window and moving it toward the end of the year to provide teachers more time for instruction and to minimize disruptions to classes.

National look at parent and family involvement

According to data recently released by the National Center for Education Statistics:

- 89% of students had parents who reported attending a school or a parent-teacher organization or association meeting.
- 78% of students had parents who attended a school or class event; 43% had parents who volunteered or served on a school committee; 59% had parents who participated in school fundraising; and 33% had parents who met with a guidance counselor.
- 83% of students in grades K-2 had parents who felt that the amount of homework their child is assigned is "about right." This percentage was significantly higher than te percentage for students in grades 3-5 (75%), students in grades 6-8 (73%), and students in grades 9-12 (70%).
- According to their parents, 94% of students in grades K-12 did homework outside of school. Among those students, 86% had a place set aside for homework in their home and 66% had an adult in the household who checked that their homework was done.
