GEORGE ROHR MEMORIAL PRESS BOX

George Rohr, former longtime Director of Buildings and Grounds for the ELCO School District passed away on April 5, 2012. The family set up a Memorial Fund in his name. In desperate need of repair, and with little money available in the school budget, the ELCO Stadium Press Box was deteriorating. It was decided by the school district and family that the stadium press box be named in memory of George Rohr with the funds being used to repair the structure. A dedication ceremony was held in October of 2012.



Stan Sicinski and Doug Bohannon spearheaded the project to repair and refurbish the George Rohr Memorial Press Box. Carrie Boyer, a member of the ELCO School Board and owner of Woodland Construction Co., was instrumental in obtaining and donating new windows, paneling, and countertops. Plain & Fancy Custom Cabinetry donated storage cabinets; and Tom Morrissey TV and Appliance and Martin Appliance donated air conditioning units. Leftover floor tiles from the newly built Intermediate School were used, and paint and other materials from Ace Hardware were obtained at a huge discount. New chairs and ceiling tiles were purchased from the memorial funds. The padded-designed chairs will also be used for indoor sports such as volleyball, basketball, and wrestling events in the high school throughout the school year.


