

ELCO HALL OF FAME

The Eastern Lebanon County School District Hall of Fame seeks to recognize individuals who have achieved noteworthy and outstanding accomplishments in their chosen fields and who will serve as role models for students currently enrolled in the ELCO School District. Individuals who are selected to the ELCO School District Hall of Fame are recognized during ELCO's Homecoming activities in the fall of each year. Additionally, a commemorative plaque signifying the individual's selection is hung on the "ELCO Hall of Fame" wall, which is located in the main hallway of the ELCO High School.

In order to be considered for selection into the ELCO School District Hall of Fame, candidates must have been a member of a class that graduated at least 10 years prior to nomination and must have attended public school within the boundaries of the Eastern Lebanon County School District. Previous nominees have demonstrated outstanding records of performance in a profession, business, occupation, and/or public service. Once nominated, that candidate will be considered for five (5) consecutive years and need not be nominated each year.

Nomination forms for the 2015 ELCO School District Hall of Fame will be available in the coming weeks on the school district's website and in the ELCO High School main office. Nomination forms and supporting documentation must be submitted to the High School office by Thursday, May 14, 2015 in order to be considered for the 2015 Hall of Fame selection. After this date a selection committee, comprised of individuals representing the school community, will review all received nomination forms and the 2015 ELCO Hall of Fame inductee will be chosen.

JACKSON ELEMENTARY WINS FRIGO CHEESE HEADS COMPANY - BUILD A BRIGHT FUTURE PROMOTION

It is with great pleasure that I have the opportunity to communicate this wonderful news with the ELCO community. Jackson Elementary School has been blessed to have such wonderful support and outreach from students, teachers, parents, the PTO, and the community to rally behind the Parham Family and support our cause to purchase inclusive playground equipment for the school.

In honor of their son, Rees Parham, Mr. and Mrs. Parham asked for their Make-a-Wish® contribution to be put towards inclusive playground equipment for students with special needs. The Make-a-Wish Foundation of America® contributed \$9,000 to the



ELCO School District to help kick start fundraising efforts to purchase the playground equipment. Unfortunately, playground equipment for schools is expensive and will cost approximately \$50,000 or more. As this is a great start, we have a long way to go to accomplish this goal.

In the beginning of the school year, Jackson Elementary School PTO President, Mrs. Paula Plummer, organized an application for a promotion she found to help raise money for the new playground at Jackson Elementary School. This was the *Build a Bright Future Promotion* run by the Frigo® Cheese Heads Company®, which is a division of Saputo Cheese USA, Inc. Information, along with the application, was sent home with all students the first week of school for this national contest. Mrs. Plummer organized and promoted the reason for the contest and helped to encourage the community to submit the application for Jackson Elementary School to win the promotion.

Around mid October of 2014, I was contacted by Saputo Cheese USA, Inc. and told that Jackson Elementary School was nominated as one of the top 10 schools in the country. This prestigious honor guaranteed Jackson Elementary to receive \$1,000 and the chance to win a total of \$4,000! With the wonderful efforts of members from the Jackson Elementary PTO, we started getting the word out to vote for Jackson Elementary School to become a possible winner of the grand prize of \$4,000! In true ELCO fashion, the community rallied around this family and the voting began.

After being told Jackson Elementary School was one of the top five schools in the country, we quickly organized an assembly with the help of representatives from the Frigo® Cheese Heads Company® to present the check with the Parham Family and students present. Representatives told us that they were surprised and "awe struck" when driving through our community. They felt a great sense of pride and went on to tell us that our school, Jackson Elementary, received the most application entries in the country for this promotion. In addition to the most applications submitted, our school received the most votes in the country! In fact, we received over 7,000 more votes than the next school nominated!

The winning entry was written and submitted by Mrs. Michelle Wolf. Her entry was posted on the Frigo® Cheese Heads Company® Facebook page, which is where the voting took place. This was one of many entries that was submitted by members of the ELCO community. Mrs. Wolf wrote the following:

SENIOR VOLUNTEER TAX PROGRAM

Applications Due by June 30th

The ELCO School District will, again, offer an opportunity for retired senior citizen homeowners who are 60 years of age or older, to participate in the senior volunteer tax work-off program.

The program allows retired senior citizens to volunteer up to 76 hours at \$7.25 per hour, for a tax credit totaling a maximum of \$550. Participants may continue to volunteer after reaching 76 hours but will not receive tax credit for those hours. Tasks may include selling tickets at athletic events, tutoring children, assisting with drama productions, serving as an advisor to student groups, working as substitute custodians, or grounds keeping within the district.

A criminal history and child abuse background check is required for anyone working in a public school. The cost of the background checks is \$10 each for a total of \$20 per person.

Applications must be submitted annually and are available on the website by choosing the "*District Information*" link and "*Volunteering within the District*" or by contacting Tina Kunder at (717) 866-7117 ext. 2313.

Reminder: Applicants must submit a new application each year even if they were previously enrolled in the program.



As the winter season winds down, let's take note of what has been happening with the sports programs here at ELCO. We have approximately two hundred twenty students participating on our winter teams. All of these athletes are growing and learning through participation in athletics. The varsity activities we offer through the winter months are cheerleading, bowling, indoor track, wrestling, and basketball for girls and boys. We also offer wrestling, basketball, and cheerleading on the junior high level.

Cheerleading

The cheerleading squad can be seen and heard at the boys' basketball games. Layne Conners is the lone senior on the squad, which consists of sixteen girls. The squad is coached by first year head coach Ashley Huttenstine, and the assistant coach is Alysha Burkholder.

Wrestling

The wrestling team finished the dual meet season with a 20-5 record and qualified for the District III AAA tournament. The team lost in the first round to Exeter, placed second at the Delco Duals going 4-1, won their own tournament in December and also won the Twin Valley Duals going undefeated in both tournaments. Good luck to all the wrestlers that will advance into post-season competition.

Bowling

The bowling team is having a great season under the direction of third year head coach Mike Rittle. The team is currently in second and hopes to qualify for the league team tournament. Top bowlers for ELCO are Joe Rittle, Rachel Rittle, Ryan Stone, and Dylan Landuyt. Best of luck to the entire team as they continue their season and post-season competition.

Indoor Winter Track & Field

The indoor track team is under the direction of first year head coach Robert Miller. The group participated in Invitational Meets at Kutztown University and Albright College. This program serves as a tune-up for the upcoming spring track season.

Girls' Basketball

The girls' basketball team finished their season with a 9-13 record. The team consisted of three seniors: Cassie Shimp, Claire Shaak, and Andria Harpold.

Boys' Basketball

The boys' team completed the regular season with a 13-9 record. They qualified for the District III AAA tournament and will play East Pennsboro. The Raiders were led by junior Colton Lawrence who is 30 points shy of scoring a career 1,000 points. The team consisted of two seniors, Dustin Miller and Jesse Kline.

Swimming

ELCO does not offer the sport of swimming, however, students can compete as individuals in hopes of qualifying for league and district meets. Freshmen Emma Flesher placed 6th in the 200 Freestyle at the Muhlenberg Mayhem Invitational. She will participate in the Lancaster-Lebanon League Meet and a chance to qualify for the District III AA Championships.
