KINDERGARTEN 2016-2017 INFORMATION



If you have a child who will be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2016, he or she is eligible to be registered for Kindergarten during the 2016-2017 school year. A packet containing all necessary paperwork required for your child to begin Kindergarten in the fall may be picked-up at either Fort Zeller Elementary School or Jackson Elementary School beginning the week of January 25, 2016 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and **4:00 p.m. daily.** Or, if you prefer you may download the documents from the website. It is requested that all forms be completed and returned to your respective elementary school office no later than April 15, 2016. We understand that some forms and appointments (dental and physical exams) may not be completed by this time; however, this date will allow ample time for processing of information prior to your child's kindergarten screening which will occur during the week of April 25 through April 28, 2016. Please try to have as much paperwork completed as possible and necessary appointments scheduled! Upon returning the required paperwork, you will receive the date and time of your child's kindergarten screening.

ELCO HALL OF FAME

The Eastern Lebanon County School District Hall of Fame seeks to recognize individuals who have achieved noteworthy and outstanding accomplishments in their chosen fields and who will serve as role models for students currently enrolled in the ELCO School District. Individuals who are selected to the ELCO School District Hall of Fame are recognized during ELCO's Homecoming activities in the fall of each year. Additionally, a commemorative plaque signifying the individual's selection is hung on the "ELCO Hall of Fame" wall, which is located in the main hallway of the ELCO High School.

In order to be considered for selection into the ELCO School District Hall of Fame, candidates must have been a member of a class that graduated at least 10 years prior to nomination and must have attended public school within the boundaries of the Eastern Lebanon County School District. Previous nominees have demonstrated outstanding records of performance in a profession, business, occupation, and/or public service. Once nominated, that candidate will be considered for five (5) consecutive years and need not be nominated each year; nominated individuals may have pertinent material added to their application as long as the information is submitted by the deadline for all nominations as stated below. In the event an individual is not selected within five (5) years of being nominated, a new nomination form must be submitted for future consideration.

SENIOR VOLUNTEER TAX PROGRAM

Applications Due by June 30th

The ELCO School District will, again, offer an opportunity for retired senior citizen homeowners who are 60 years of age or older, to participate in the senior volunteer tax work-off program.

The program allows retired senior citizens to volunteer up to 76 hours at \$7.25 per hour, for a tax credit totaling a maximum of \$550. Participants may continue to volunteer after reaching 76 hours but will not receive tax credit for those hours. Tasks may include selling tickets at athletic events, tutoring children, assisting with drama productions, serving as an advisor to student groups, working as substitute custodians, or grounds keeping within the district.

A criminal history and child abuse background check are required for anyone working in a public school. Both can be acquired at no cost when choosing "Volunteer".

ATHLETICALLY SPEAKING

As the winter season winds down, let's take note of what has been happening with the sports programs here at ELCO. We have approximately one hundred ninety students participating on our winter teams. All of these athletes are growing and learning through participation in athletics. The varsity activities that we offer through the winter months are cheerleading, bowling, wrestling, and girls and boys basketball. We also offer wrestling, basketball, and cheerleading on the junior high level. Unfortunately, this year we were unable to find coaches to field a winter track team.

Cheerleading

The cheerleading squad can be seen and heard at the boys' basketball games. This winter season we had ten seniors on the squad, which consists of sixteen girls. The squad is coached by first year head coach Alysha Burkholder and the assistant coach is Elizabeth Yearwood.

Wrestling

The wrestling team finished the dual meet season with a 20-4 record and qualified for the District III AAA tournament. The team lost in the first round to Cedar Cliff. The team placed first at the Delco Duals going 5-0 and finished second in their own tournament on January 2nd. Congratulations to Ryan Rolon who won the Lancaster-Lebanon League Championship in the heavyweight division. Good luck to all the wrestlers that will advance into individual post-season competition.

Bowling

The bowling team is having a great season under the direction of fourth year head coach Mike Rittle. The team finished second place in the section but has advanced to the League Team Tournament. The team has also qualified for the Team Regional Tournament. Top bowlers for ELCO are Joe Rittle, Ryan Stone, Jacob Hitz, Aaron Deitz, Dylan Landuyt, and Josh Pagan. Best of luck to the entire team as they continue their season and post-season competition.

Girls' Basketball

The girls' basketball team finished the regular season with a 15-7 record. The girls have qualified for the District III Tournament and will play Susquehannock in the first round on February 17th. The team consisted of one lone senior, Chandelle Keller. The girls' team has a bright future.



Boys' Basketball

The boys' team completed the regular season with a 19-3 record finishing in second place of Section 3 and qualified for the League Playoffs. Unfortunately, the team lost to McCaskey but will host a first round District III playoff game against Steel High on Tuesday, February 16th beginning at 7 p.m. Congratulations to Colton Lawrence who eclipsed the 1,000-point mark in his career and became the all-time leading scorer in ELCO boys' basketball history. The team consisted of two other seniors also, Caleb Buchmoyer and Dylan Stoops.

Swimming

ELCO does not offer the sport of swimming but students can compete as individuals in hopes of qualifying for League and District Meets. Emma Flesher and Danika Boltz competed for ELCO this season. Emma qualified for the Lancaster-Lebanon League Meet in the 500-meter freestyle race.
